EBERHARDT, Henry F., Age 79 of Philadelphia, passed away unexpectedly on March 13, 2023. Beloved son of the late Daniel and Mary (nee Herman) Eberhardt, Henry is survived by his siblings Daniel L. and Maryanne Piccari, his nieces and nephew, and his great nieces and nephews.

After graduating from Cardinal Dougherty High School in 1961, Henry enlisted in the U.S. Army, progressing to the rank of Sergeant, where he worked as a Meteorological Team Chief. After his honorable discharge, he continued his education at LaSalle College, graduating Magna Cum Laude in 1970, and Drexel University, graduating with his MBA in Finance/International Business in 1975, attending both institutions at night while working full time.

Henry greatly enjoyed his career in the banking industry. Over his tenure with The Philadelphia National Bank, later CoreStates Financial Corporation, Henry held positions of increasing responsibility in both Philadelphia and New York City. He was an acknowledged expert in commercial banking whose areas of expertise included domestic and international bank operations and finance.

Being a Center City Philadelphia resident, he enjoyed the ability to walk to all the places he needed to go including the Reading Terminal Market and St. John the Evangelist Church, where he practiced his faith and volunteered many hours of his time to ensure its preservation and upkeep.

Henry will be remembered for his faith, intelligence, wit, and wisdom. He had the uncanny ability to recall important dates and sports outcomes. He was an

avid fan of the Philadelphia Eagles and was a season ticket holder for almost two decades (he could tell you exactly how many seasons!). He enjoyed his daily Wall Street Journal and was always quick to cut out (rip out) any information family or friends would find interesting.

He will be missed at family functions and holiday dinners, where he was always happy for a home cooked meal, and we were always happy to have him there.
