John D. Snyder of Philadelphia peacefully passed away on September 28, 2021 at the age of 78. John was born in Philadelphia to Olivia Snyder (née Galvin) and John J. Snyder. John attended Cardinal Dougherty High School and went on to La Salle College where he participated in ROTC and crewed all four years. He graduated from college in 1964 and earned his Master's at Ball State University several years later. After college, he joined the United States Air Force where he served for 27 years. He was fortunate enough to travel the world while serving his country.

John's passions were his family, friends, golf, travel (especially to Ireland), Broadway musicals, his many dogs over the years and sitting on the beach with a nice cold beer and a good cigar. He is preceded in death by his wife, Paula Snyder (née Sullivan), who was the love of his life.

John is survived by his beloved daughters: Jennifer Snyder and husband Jeff Duckworth, Kirstin Snyder and husband Michael Mitchell; also, his children through marriage Robert H.
